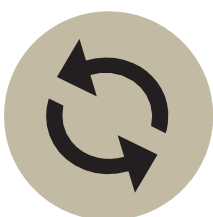

Job profile

Nature and purpose of the research project:

Affiliated to INSPIRE research unit, which relies on interdisciplinary and participatory approaches, the chairholder will focus on the patient's point of view and healthy longevity, through the development and evaluation of prevention programs and the development and validation of instruments measuring latent traits. This recruitment aims to strengthen the unit's resources in social and human sciences, especially human geography or sociology of organizations and health sciences, in order to better address social and territorial inequalities in health in the development and evaluation of prevention programs, or in the development, transcultural adaptation and validation of complex health measurement instruments (PROMS and PREMS). Through its involvement in the LIFE-TRAVEL project, the chairholder will benefit from opportunities to collaborate with researchers from several research units of Université de Lorraine, to address prevention program development across ages to promote healthy aging.

Needs have emerged within INSPIRE to take greater account of social and territorial inequalities in health in the development and evaluation of prevention programs, and in particular their effects on perceptual outcomes based on latent traits. The LIFE-TRAVEL project, co-directed by INSPIRE, includes a work package focusing on the development of prevention programs. With ageing populations and increased life expectancy, healthy life expectancy is becoming a public health issue. As a result, the need for effective lifelong prevention programs, particularly in terms of perceived health, is bound to increase.

This chair is designed to widen our interdisciplinary approach of the two core research themes of INSPIRE with a new discipline. It will strengthen our national and international visibility in these fields.

Through its longstanding partnerships with researchers from Canadian, Australian and American universities, the INSPIRE unit will be able to offer the chairholder extensive opportunities for international collaboration on the unit's themes. The recent partnership with LIH (Luxembourg) will also consolidate European links, complementing those already built up by the Antibiovac axis in the field of promoting antimicrobial stewardship and tackling antibiotic resistance. The chairholder network will further extend the scope for international collaboration, opening the unit's doors to internationally recruited students and PhD students.

Nature and purpose of the proposed teaching project:

The chairholder will be responsible for teaching in the Master of Public Health and its 3 courses: Prevention and health promotion; Ethics of care, public health and new technologies; Epidemiology, clinical research and evaluation. He will also be responsible for offering internships in the INSPIRE laboratory to Master students, and for supervising doctoral students. He or she will also act as a mentor for the health service internship for health students, as well as a teacher for Social and human sciences courses within the public health teaching units of the medical curriculum.

Research profile:

Holder of a PhD in Social and human sciences (human geography or sociology of organizations) oriented on a public health issue, the candidate must have experience in project management: project design, field investigations (with a preference for experience in conducting qualitative investigations: semi-structured interviews, monographs, observation...), data analysis (preferably qualitative, with proficiency in NVivo software), and valorization through publication of scientific articles in international peer-reviewed journals.

The candidate must have experience in supervising Master's students. An "Habilitation à diriger les recherches (HDR)" would be appreciated. If not, experience in co-directing PhD students will also be appreciated, with a clear perspective to graduate in HDR within 5 years.

Through his/her publications, the candidate must hold expertise in social or territorial health inequalities.

Particular attention will be paid to the scientific collaborations forged by the candidate, as well as the publications stemming from these collaborations. The candidate's inclination for participatory approaches and his/her experience in interdisciplinary initiatives will also be appreciated.
