

PLANNING YOUR BUDGET

WHY PLAN A BUDGET?

- ✓ First step before deciding to study in France: Make sure you have enough money to finance the entire duration of your studies and stay in France
- ✓ Be aware of the difference in living costs between your country and France
- ✓ If you don't have the budget, consider postponing your stay in France
- ✓ Avoid the stress of financial problems that could affect your health and studies
- ✓ For non-EU nationals: provide proof of a minimum of 615 euros (excluding social benefits) per month for the visa and residence permit. (Webinar 2)

Establish a realistic budget:

- ✓ **List your resources:** only resources you can rely on, such as scholarships (if you have a scholarship certificate) and your own income
- Please note: do not include any financial help (conditionally granted, NOT guaranteed, etc.) such as housing benefit (e.g. APL) or income from a possible job.
- ✓ List your expenses: find out the real cost of living in France
- Beware: prices are rising in France, particularly for rents and energy (gas/electricity)
- ✓ Plan all expenses before your departure, on arrival and throughout your study stay in France



















EXPENSES BEFORE LEAVING

- ✓ Visa application (cost varies by country)
- ✓ Booking fees for accommodation: for example CROUS = approx. € 100.
- ✓ Deposit for accommodation: about one month's rent (CROUS approx. € 300)
- ✓ Accommodation and liability insurance: € 30 for a CROUS accommodation
- ✓ Flight, train or bus tickets
- Translation of official documents

Please note: this list is not exhaustive and depends on your situation.





















- Tuition fees (can be paid over 3 consecutive months)
- "CVEC" tax (Contribution de Vie Etudiante et de Campus): €103 (not for exchange students)
- Visa validation fee (if VLS-TS visa): € 50, or residence permit application fee: € 75
- Accommodation: first month's rent, security deposit, opening of gas, electricity and water meters, if necessary
- Food, furniture and equipment (if unfurnished accommodation)

Please note: this list is not exhaustive and depends on your situation





















- Groceries: between €150 and €200
- Housing (rent, insurance, etc.): between €300 and €650, depending on your type of accommodation
- Mobile plan between € 15 and € 30 / month
- Complementary health insurance between € 20 and € 50
- Bank account €5
- Cleaning and hygiene products € 20 and € 40
- ✓ Transport: between €20 and €35
- Entertainment: cinema (€ 7-10), student discount



BOOKING ACCOMMODATION













IMPORTANT INFORMATION

✓ Book your accommodation before you arrive:


- In France, booking accommodation is a very "administrative" (and time-consuming)
 process
- Don't wait until the beginning of the academic year to look for accommodation as it will be too late to have a choice and the best rates.
- Don't count on temporary accommodation, especially at the start of the academic year
- ✓ **Apply for a visa at the same time as you apply for accommodation:** You'll need proof of residence to apply for your visa!

Beware of scams:

- Paid accommodation certificates do not guarantee real accommodation
- Beware of false advertisements (private accommodation reservation websites)
- Don't rent without a real rental contract (lease), and always ask for a rent receipt as proof
 of payment







OUR TIPS



Other steps to take when looking for accommodation:

- Prepare the documents you need for your rental file:
- A guarantor (explanations on slide 25)
- Housing insurance (Webinar 2, July 2nd)

- Prepare your means of payment:
- Make sure you have an international bank card that allows payments abroad
- and check your foreign payment limits









What is a "garant"? Une « caution locative » (or « cautionnement »)?

A person (e.g. your parents, another member of your family, a friend, etc) or an organization (e.g. Visale) that makes a commitment to pay your rent if you are unable to do so. It's a payment guarantee for landlords.

Who can be a "garant" for international students?

You need a guarantor who lives in France.

Don't know anyone who can act as a guarantor?



Apply for the Visale guarantee free of charge (under 31)

You need a visa to apply for the "Visale guarantee".

That's why you need to apply for accommodation and a visa at the same time! Need some help? Take a look at Campus France's Visale tutorial





























- Different from a guarantor
- ✓ This is a sum of money (1 or 2 months' rent) that you pay to the landlord.
- ✓ It is used to pay for repairs ("reparation") in the event of damage to your property.
- ✓ The landlord will return this sum to you if you have not made any significant damage to your accommodation within 1 month of your departure.









DIFFERENT TYPES OF ACCOMMODATION

Private student residences, studios or shared apartments...



HOW TO BOOK CROUS ACCOMMODATION?

- Create your account now.
 Check "I don't have an INE".
- Students on individual mobility: From July 11, make your housing choices. Exchange students: you have already completed this step but you are concerned by the following steps
- As soon as you receive your accommodation proposal, confirm it by paying the €100 online booking fee by credit card within 10 days. => Proof of payment = proof of accommodation for your visa application
- As soon as you've confirmed your booking, start completing your rental file within 7 days. You have 15 days to complete it, including your guarantor file (Visale or other) and your housing insurance
- 5 Before your arrival, complete and sign the administrative file for your Cité-U
- Before your arrival, pay the security deposit (approx. 1 month's rent) online by credit card
- Before your arrival, make an appointment with your residence to collect the keys. There will be no access to your room without an appointment.










IN WHAT ORDER SHOULD I DO MY PAPERWORK?

HOW TO BOOK A PRIVATE ACCOMMODATION?

Private housing

- ✓ Private student residences: Open to all students, available all year round, often for short periods
- ✓ Apartments or studios: You can rent from a landlord or a real estate agency
- Co-location: share an apartment with other students, an economical, practical and friendly housing solution

BOOK WITH STUDAPART?

WHY?

- Another Université de Lorraine partner: reliable
- All types of furnished accommodation (flatshare, studio, homestay, etc)
- Multilingual advisors (rapid response)
- Online registration and fast reservation: 24 to 48 hours
- Opportunity to speak with owner before booking
- ✓ Immediate, visa-free Studapart guarantee: 4% of total booking amount
- ✓ Online payment: 1st month's rent + Studapart guarantee (4%) + reservation fees (€ 180-300)
- ✓ If the owner cancels the reservation, Studapart will rehouse you


















