






WHO NEEDS A VISA?

If I'm a citizen of an EU country, Iceland, Norway, Liechtenstein or Switzerland, I don't need to apply for a visa.



If I'm a citizen of another country, I need to apply for a visa.
























THE DIFFERENT TYPES OF VISAS



- ✓ Short-stay visa (less than 90 days): competitive examination, internship, etc.
- ✓ Visa Long Séjour valant Titre de Séjour (VLS-TS): student, mobility program or trainee - validity + 90 days max 1 year (depending on proof provided)
- ✓ Visa Long séjour "Carte de séjour à solliciter à l'arrivée en France" (Algerian student /"Mineur scolarisé" Minor in school: at majority = 18 years old)
- ✓ Temporary residence permit exemption visa (3 to 12 months): WARNING: NO EXTENSION POSSIBLE















WHICH VISA TO CHOOSE?

You **MUST** arrive with <u>the right visa*</u> because the purpose of the visa cannot be changed once you arrive on French territory.

HOW TO APPLY FOR A VISA IF MY COUNTRY OF RESIDENCE IS NOT PART OF EEF: 2. FRANCE VISA








Apply for a visa directly on: France
VISA



at the French consulate and then pick up your visa in your country of residence





How much is it? €50 for Etudes in France and €100 for all others



















WHAT DOCUMENTS DO I NEED TO APPLY FOR A VISA?

- 01 VALID PASSPORT (over 6 months)
- PROOF OF RESIDENCE IN FRANCE
- PROOF OF ADMISSION OR INTERNSHIP AGREEMENT

- 04 FINANCIAL RESOURCES
- O5 AN INTERNATIONAL BANK CARD

Please note: You must be able to justify a minimum monthly income of 615 euros for the entire duration of your stay in France.

<u>Please note</u>: to prove your income, you can provide a guarantor (= a person from France or another country who can prove that he/she will pay you a minimum of €615/month). For your accommodation, you will also be asked to provide also a guarantor (=a person living in France who undertakes to pay your rent if you are unable to do so). This can be 2 different people, or the same person for the visa and accommodation if he/she is living in France.















ADVICES ABOUT VISA

- Before submitting your application, make sure that the documents you provide meet all the requirements. If not, your application may take longer to process, which could delay your arrival in France.
- Some courses have a deadline for arrival mentioned in the admission letter. If your visa application has been delayed, don't take your tickets, and don't come to France without first contacting the academic department of your future course to find out whether you can still enter the course or not.
- If you are continuing your studies in France next year or in subsequent years, when you apply for a residence permit you will need to provide proof of: the reason for your stay (studies + real and serious nature of the studies with transcripts), accommodation nearby, income of €615/month.

















WHERE TO APPLY FOR A VISA?

The French visa allows entry into France, and is issued by the French consulate abroad.

Depending on the documents provided, the consulate decides:

- ✓ Whether or not to issue the visa
- ✓ The type of visa issued, which depends on:
- duration (short or long stay)
- reason for stay (competition, study, mobility or internship)





















WHY IT'S IMPORTANT TO ARRIVE WITH THE RIGHT VISA?



If the purpose (reason) of my visa is not the right one:

- No entitlement to social assistance (health insurance, housing benefit) or work benefits
- No change of reason possible
- No extension possible (trainee visa)

=> You will have to return to your country to make another application!



If your visa is REFUSED, you must reapply and pay again (€100)






WHAT SHOULD I DO WITH MY VISA ONCE I ARRIVE IN FRANCE? YOUR RESIDENCE FORMALITIES



The sooner you complete your residency formalities, the sooner your other administrative formalities (health insurance, CAF) will go through.

Diferent formalities depending on your visa:

- ✓ Validation for VLS-TS for whatever reason (student, mobility program, trainee) on the ANEF platform : ANEF platform
- Residence permit application for:
 - Visa marked "Carte de séjour à solliciter à l'arrivée"
 (Residence permit to be applied for on arrival) on <u>ANEF</u>
 - ➤ Visa mentioning "Mineur scolarisé" Minors in school contact us at the age of majority (18 years old)
 - > C "concours" visa only if admitted to the competition for which the visa was issued contact us

How soon? As soon as possible, but no later than 3 months after your arrival in France.

How much does it cost? Buy a "timbre fiscal" tax stamp (online or at a tobacco shop): €50 for a VLS-TS / €75 for a 1st residence permit.





















- 1. Housing insurance
- 2. Civil liability insurance
- 3. Health insurance
- ✓ If you have a car, it's compulsory to have insurance























I checked with my insurance company and civil liability is included in my home insurance...

- ✓ Also known as « l'assurance logement ou habitation » or « Assurance risques locatifs »
- ✓ Compulsory for <u>any kind of accommodation</u> (private, Student housing at Crous, etc.)
- ✓ Housing insurance protects you against damage or loss in your apartment or room. For example, if something is damaged by fire, flood or theft, insurance helps pay for repairs or replacement
- Check that your insurance covers theft (not all insurances do)
- You cannot rent a property without this insurance. Compulsory for all accommodation (empty or furnished), a certificate will be requested when you receive the keys to your home
- ✓ Chargeable (approx. €20/year) compare offers
- You can buy it on <u>Feel-Français</u> or directly from a bank or insurance company such as MGEL/Yvon (UL's partner), ADH and others.

























Civil liability insurance: La responsabilité civile



checked with my insurance company and civil liability is included in my home insurance...

- Is compulsory (for EVERYONE in France)
- Is a protection that covers damage you may cause to other people or their property. For example, if you accidentally spill a glass of water on a friend's laptop and it's damaged, your civil liability insurance may pay to repair or replace it.
- Chargeable (around €20/year) but often included in home insurance (check with your insurer).
- You can buy this insurance with a bank or insurance company such as MGEL (UL's partner), ADH, and others. You must provide proof of liability insurance to the university.

ATTENTION: if you're staying with someone, you don't pay home insurance in your own name, you'll need to check whether or not you're already insured for third-party liability (in your other contracts, e.g. supplementary health insurance, travel insurance, etc.). If not, you'll need to insure yourself.











The DIFFERENT TYPES of HEALTH INSURANCE



⇒ Covers about 70% of the costs except hospital and some other costs

Complementary coverage

⇒ To cover the remaining costs at your charge

Solidarity health insurance

OR

Student mutuals























- ✓ European Health Insurance Card (EHIC):
- If you're a national of a European Union or European Economic Area country, you don't need to register with the French health insurance system. The EHIC is a free personal card that you need to apply for in your own country before coming to France.
- It allows your health insurance in your country to continue to cover your healthcare expenses in France. Ask the EHIC to your national health insurance.
- ✓ Health insurance for students outside the European Union (EU):
- ✓ If you are coming to France, you must register for French health insurance online here.

Exception: If you have a short-stay visa (3 months) or an "Intern" visa and you are not from the EU, take out insurance in your country before you leave to cover the costs of illness, maternity and hospitalization.

When should you register?

As soon as you arrive in France, **after validating your visa online** here: https://etudiant-etranger.ameli.fr/#/

Documents required:

- Passport and visa
- ✓ Visa validation (to be done in advance).
- ✓ Birth certificate (with parents' names and dates of birth).
- ✓ Translated (otherwise your registration will take longer).
- University registration certificate (or letter of admission in the meantime)
- ✓ French or European RIB (IBAN)

Good to know: Your health insurance will start on the date of your arrival in France. Keep your invoices if you need health treatments before finalizing your registration.

COMPLEMENTARY HEALTH INSURANCE

- Also called "mutuelle ou mutuelle étudiante"
- This is private, fee-based insurance that helps pay for medical expenses
- ✓ It covers what basic health insurance doesn't fully cover. For example, if you have to pay for a doctor's visit, medication or dental care, a "mutuelle" can reimburse some or all of these costs.
- ✓ This means you can reduce your healthcare costs and get better care without spending too much.
- ✓ The level of reimbursement depends on the contract you choose, according to your health needs
- Compare the different 'mutuelles étudiantes' offers before making your choice



My complementary health insurance allowed me to buy new glasses























To find a mutual insurance company adapted to your health needs (e.g.: need for glasses, dentist...) and compare:

- Monthly premium rates
- ✓ The amount of reimbursements offered

Where to buy a mutual insurance?

- ✓ Feel-français (access code : 6753098)
- ✓ MGEL, LMDE, HEYME, ...
- Complémentaire Santé Solidaire (C2S = CMU) : This is the solidarity health insurance that is the complementary health insurance of the Assurance Maladie. Monthly rates are based on your financial resources. More information on ameli.fr click here



LE SERVICE DE SANTÉ ETUDIANTE DE L'UNIVERSITÉ DE LORRAINE (SSE)

























The University's Student Health Service offers students free, confidential consultations at all Université de Lorraine sites.

Don't miss these two appointments:

- The "Bilan de Santé" check up appointment (preventive medicine): After registering for your courses the SSE invites you to review your medical, social and psychological situation.
- The tuberculosis screening appointment for non-EU students.
- *You can use the "convocation" appointment email to justify your absence and not be penalized for missing a class.

How can I contact the SSE?

To contact a health professional (doctor, nurse...) or a social worker, contact the SSE nearest to your campus:

- ✓ Online
- ✓ By telephone or e-mail
- ✓ In person at one of our reception desks



vaccinations are up to date, I can contact the SSE to do it for free.























Some examples of essential documents:

- ✓ Valid identity card for European students
- ✓ Valid passport; and if you are a non-EU national: Visa D " Étudiant ", " Stagiaire ", "Mineur scolarisé" or visa C "Concours".
- ✓ Originals and certified copies of your birth certificate (with dates of birth and) parents' surname(s) - first name(s)) and originals and certified copies of its translation into French by a sworn translator
